Primary Duties and Responsibilities

The IDA Director of Engagement will perform the following duties:

- Administer all aspects of the IDA Chapter program, including formation and
 establishment of LLCs, Delegates, and Affiliates, overseeing and managing annual
 reporting requirements to ensure full compliance with IDA guidelines and policies,
 responding to inquiries regarding the IDA Chapter program, revising and amending
 the Chapter Manual and other documents as necessary, and keeping the Executive
 Director apprised of emerging issues, questions and concerns regarding the Chapter
 program.
- Provide the support necessary to foster the long-term growth and development of IDA's Chapters, Delegates, and other grassroots, including resources that promote leadership and community organizing skills.
- Develop strategies to support grassroots engagement around the issue of light pollution, including the development of "how to" resources and toolkits, providing online training workshops and webinars, and creating campaigns that energize,

mobliize and build the grassroots community and that increase IDA's visibility and membership base.

- Establish and administer IDA's online grassroots network forum (Slack).
- Develop and maintain a database of contacts that serves as the conduit between IDA and grassroots networks, including,
 - o IDA Chapters, Delegates and Affiliates
 - Subject-matter experts
 - Energy policy contacts
 - Decision-makers
 - Astronomy groups
 - Influencers
- Attend events and represent IDA at public presentations.
- Embrace and model IDA's organizational culture of philanthropy by supporting all facets of fundraising and development, including donor cultivation, grant writing, annual appeals, and membership recruitment.

Qualifications and Desired Skills

The Director of Engagement should demonstrate competence in the following areas:

- Fully committed to the mission and goals of IDA.
- Mobilizing citizen groups, grassroots organizations, and local communities to achieve clearly defined outcomes.
- Working constructively across constituency groups and stakeholders, including those in the international community.
- Community organizing, leadership development, and fostering the development of alliances and coalitions around the issue of light pollution.
- Exceptional oral and written communication skills and the ability to listen and learn.
- Strong social and networking skills that facilitate connecting individuals to one another and to a larger movement.
- Comfortable making public presentations and responding media inquiries.
- Conversant in the issue of light pollution a plus.
- Understand and demonstrate ethical behavior and practices that are consistent and align with the values of IDA.
- Work cooperatively and effectively with others to set goals, resolve problems, and make decisions that enhance IDA's effectiveness.
- Experience in the nonprofit sector.
- Teaching background a plus in developing toolkits, campaigns and other resources
- Able to make meaningful connections via remote tools, such as Skype, email and other means.
- Positive, uplifting with an innate ability to inspire.
- Big-picture thinker and able to synthesize information from multiple sources.
